

**Probationary Period for Maintenance Employee's Policy & Procedure**

**Policy 06-2022**

The first six (6) months of continuous employment, or of a contractual agreement, at the Town of Birch Hills are considered to be a probationary period. The probationary period commences on the first scheduled day of work.

**Procedure(s)**

- The probationary period represents, for the employee, an opportunity to learn his or her tasks and responsibilities, how the Town of Birch Hills functions, as well as get to know his or her co-workers.
- During the probationary period, Council and the Administrator will evaluate the employee's behavior and ability to do the job.
- At any time during the first six (6) months, an employee may resign with no harmful effect on his or her record. If during this period the employee's work habits, abilities, attitude, attendance or performance do not meet the employer's standards, Council may terminate the employee during the probationary period at any time, and the person on probation shall have no recourse.
- Throughout the six (6) months, Council and the Administrator will meet with the employee to discuss his or her performance. Council will confirm whether the employee will be hired permanently at the end of the six (6) months.
- Probationary employees are encouraged to present their comments and ideas during these discussions.
- A former employee rehired after an absence of longer than one (1) year will be considered to be a probationary employee during the first six (6) months after being rehired.
