

## Mayor's Summer Report, 2025

In 2023 the Town Council initiated an inspection of some of the sewer lines in the older part of the town, Council budgeted \$30,000. to inspect and hydro vac the lines. Inspection indicated that several manholes needed work, as well parts of the main sewer lines needed to be replaced. It was the objective of Council to inspect all the sewer lines over a 5-year period and to repair as required.

Instead of digging up all the affected areas, Council has engaged a company to reline the necessary manholes and to repair by relining the damaged sewer lines. This work will be completed July 15-18 and will affect Stevens Ave and McCallum Ave from 2nd Street to 5th Street; this work was budgeted to cost \$255,500. In the current year.

This work will continue as required over the next several years to ensure that the infrastructure of the town is maintained in good condition.

Additionally, the Town has directed the engineers to develop detailed plans for an additional cell in the lagoon. We have received funding through Canada Community Building Fund for an extension to our lagoon with an anticipated budget of 1.3 million dollars to be cost shared by the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments
