THE BIRCH HILLS GOLF COURSE is looking for interested people to work on the golf course itself and in the clubhouse. Students welcome, but you must have a drivers license. Job duties for the golf course include operating and maintaining equipment required for the upkeep of the golf course, such as various mowers, chain saws, trimmers, snow blowers, tractors, water pumps, sprayers and sharpeners, and also includes working with various types of irrigation. You should have some mechanical abilities to provide routine repairs to mowers, blades, golf carts, etc.

You must also be physically fit to perform upgrades to the course itself, including cutting and replacing sod with gravel for cart paths, trimming trees, etc. A good working knowledge of workplace safety would be an asset. Working conditions for all positions may include shift rotations and/or working 12 hour shifts and weekends. Duties inside the clubhouse include reception, sales and services to clients, booking tee times and tournaments over the phone and in person, renting out golf carts and golf clubs, operating a cash register and debit/charge machine, providing information on policies as set by the golf course board. As well, individuals are responsible for the preparation, cooking and serving full course and short order meals, under the general direction of the clubhouse manager.
