End of Festival Special awards went to Hunter Stubbs- a Dedication Award for ages 11 – 12, to Brooke Gaudet and Lexi Doderai - a "So you know you can dance" Duet award, and to "Divas Helping Divas"- a special Group Cohesiveness Award.

Only the senior dance groups, solos,duets & trios went to Warman's Dance Madness Competition on April 23 - 25. Out of 15 dance schools competing, Birch Hills came home with 9 Gold awards for 1st place with a mark of 85 or higher, 7 Silver awards for 2nd place with a mark of 80 or higher and 3 Bronze for marks of 75 or higher.

Special Adjudicator Choice Awards went to Jaemynn Hoey to a deserving dancer (any age) Impact Dance Company Summer School Full Scholarship; and cash awards to Lexi Doderai and Brooke Gaudet for their Contemporary Duet (any age) and to Jaemynn Hoey for her Modern Solo (any age.) 
