

TOWN NOTICE: To all residents of Birch Hills

Birch Hills currently has a nuisance abatement bylaw in place to provide an efficient and effective means of regulating and encouraging the abatement of unsightly premises and other nuisances within the town of Birch Hills.

The intentions of this bylaw are to provide for the safety, health, and welfare of the people in the neighborhood; people's use and enjoyment of their property; or the amenity of a neighborhood.

Town Council would like to inform residents of our intent to begin enforcement of violations beginning July 1, 2015.

This will allow for cleanup of nuisance properties until this date.

Examples of potential offences listed within the bylaw are as follows:

Dilapidated buildings, overgrown grass and weeds, untidy properties, junked vehicles, trailers unhooked from vehicles, refrigerators and freezers, outdoor storage of materials, unoccupied buildings, and maintenance of yards.

SYTTENDE MAI FEST

The seventeenth of May (Syttende Mai) is Norway's Constitution Day. It is a National Holiday in Norway celebrating the day in 1814 when Norwegians first adopted their own constitution. Full independence was gained in 1905. In our area where there are many people who are descendants of immigrants from Scandinavia we feel a need to keep the celebration alive.

The Homemaker's Club of Northern Light District first sponsored a Norwegian Constitution Day program on May 17, 1970. The response was so big that they felt it had to be an annual affair, but it was too large for them to handle. They contacted other Scandinavians and after lots of telephone calls a meeting was held at T.K. Tomtene's home on April 1, 1971. There the SCANDIA CLUB was formed.

The first "SYTTENDE MAI FEST' was held May 17, 1971 in the Birch Hills Civic Center. Over 600 attended and found the place much too small. In subsequent years the event alternated between the Birch Hills School Gym and the Weldon Auditorium.

Traditionally the program consisted of singing the two national anthems- 'O CANADA' and 'JA VI ELSKER', a child's flag drill (with Norwegian costumes), display of bunads and other Scandinavian costumes, devotions, musical numbers, readings and perhaps a speaker. People came from a wide area of Saskatchewan and frrom out of province. At the close of the program table grace was sung and the audience filed past long tables loaded with lefsa, krum kake, open face sandwiches, rosettes, and many other goodies-and of course lots of coffee.

My first experience attending SYTTENDE MAI FEST was as a "non-Norwegian" wife of a "proud Scandinavian". I was a bit nervous but soon found out everyone there was either Norwegian or wished they were. At one of the celebrations there was a sale of Scandinavian articles before the program and I bought some large (22"x30") poster-type lithographs of "trolls". I later had the posters framed and decorated with hand-painted rosmalling. They are now a family treasure. In later years I helped with the children's flag drill and we learned to count to ten in Norwegian and try to sing the Norwegian anthem. One year, when I was teaching some music in the school, my ukulele class was invited to play at the Mai Fest in Weldon. We sang, and strummed, and picked, and were well received, so we felt quite proud of ourselves.

The SYTTENDE MAI FEST has been an important part of our community life and has made "Birch Hills" known far & wide. Much work has been done by many to present the programs & many have found great pleasure at attending. HERE ARE THE NAMES OF THOSE HELPING WITH THE 1990 PROGRAM




