



Notice to all Home Owners In the Town of Birch Hills

As you may or may not know the Town of Birch Hills is a member of **North Central Saskatchewan Waste Management Corp.**

This is the regional authority made up of the R.M's of Buckland, Garden River, Lakeland and Prince Albert, five villages, Albertville, Christopher Lake, Meath Park, Paddockwood and Weirdale, the Town of Birch Hills, the City of Prince Albert and The Prince Albert National Park.

This regional authority (NCSWMC) is responsible for processing the paper recycling within this region, in the last ten years the region processed a little over 30,000 tons of recycled paper and cardboard. To date we have only been able to handle paper products. Effective July 1, 2013 the region is entering a new phase of recycling and will be able To process more material which will include **household plastic & tin.**

This means that you will be able to put your household plastics and tin in the blue recycle bin. Tin cans must be rinsed to remove any food particles and any plastic detergent or food containers must be rinsed out before they are put in the recycle bin. Milk jugs and tetra pac juice boxes are also accepted


