

Northern Light Orchards, www.northernlightorchards.com located on the Northern Light Road 2 ½ miles south of the Hagen/Highway #25 intersection, began growing haskap in 2008. Local owners include Carl and Sandra Barber, Kevin and Craig Ulvild and Jason Green. Our 10 acres of haskap are well sheltered and continue to increase both in size and productivity. This fruit has a wonderful full and complex flavor and intense color without being full of seeds. Thank you to all who have provided encouragement and support since we began.

Although we sell primarily wholesale and now harvest most of our fruit mechanically, we are pleased to continue to offer U-Pick, pick on shares, or already picked- fresh or frozen haskap to all who ask as well as limited quantities of other products. We expect harvest the beginning of July. You may have experienced our fruit at local events in pancake toppings, over ice cream, or in a variety of baking. LB Distillers has an amazing liqueur made from our berries. As Bryce Wilde explained on the Dr Oz show this past winter he considers haskap one of the new "superfoods" because it is not only higher in anti-oxidants than blueberries and full of Vitamin C and other nutritional goodies it tastes great and can be consumed in many ways.




