Birch Hills Back Alley Compost Pick Up

<u>Compost is</u>...Grass leaves and tree clippings
Any wood scrap (except furniture)

<u>Compost days</u> - 1st Wednesday of every month (except when there is snow on the ground)

Please Separate

Grass, Leaves and SMALL Tree branches

- They go to compost pile.

Large tree branches, Trunks and Unpainted Wood

- They go to the burnable wood pile

Painted and Processed Wood

- They go to the **Non**durable wood pile

Handling

Compost Pile - Bagged or in Garbage cans Large Tree Parts - <u>Manageable</u> Pieces Painted and Processed Wood - <u>Manageable</u> Pieces

<u>Please</u> keep bags and other material a manageable size and weight. If it is heavy or awkward for <u>you</u>, it will be for the men trying to load it in the truck.

<u>Please</u> contact the town office if you have something that you believe is too big or too heavy and other arrangements can be made to have it removed.

First and foremost the Recreation Board would like to thank those past hockey referees, who have given their endless support, time and effort in helping with the hockey officiating in our community. It is volunteers like you that help to keep the game of hockey alive in our town. We hope that we can count on your assistance again this upcoming season.

Once again the Saskatchewan Hockey Association is partnering with Birch Hills to hold a referee clinic on November 20, 2011. This year they are introducing a two hour an on-ice session. The clinics have been shortened to half day classes giving the opportunity to run on-ice clinics immediately following the classroom portion. The clinic will run in the morning from 9 to 1pm at the Community School and the on-ice session will run from 1:30 to 3:30pm at the arena.
