Funding Assists Rec Activities in Birch Hills

RECYCLING NEWS

This article is an update for your blue recycle bin. On January 1, 2016 Saskatchewan began its involvement in a province wide multi material recycling program. This program is coordinated through Multi Material Stewart Western (MMSW) who is run by national retail suppliers who ship their products into our province in recyclable containers.

The Town of Birch Hills is a member of North Central Saskatchewan Waste Management Corporation (NCSWMC), NCSWMC is made up of 12 member municipalities, R.M.'s and resort areas stretching from Birch Hills to Waskesiu and is one of 13 regional non profit organizations in the province who coordinate their member municipalities recycling efforts. With the implementation of the new recycling rebate program all of the participating regions or municipalities must report the weight of product they collect for their area to MMSW

In Birch Hills our blue bins are picked up every second Tuesday and the material (cardboard, paper, tin, household plastics) collected is delivered to NCSWNC's Material Recovery Facility in Prince Albert. There the truck is weighed and the recycled material is unloaded and combined with the product from the other member municipalities. It is sorted for shipment to national and international recycling processors.

Through the reporting process we are required to submit to MMSW we no know that the residents of Birch Hills recycled 20,751 pounds or 9.35 tonnes of material in the first three months of 2016.

In the future I will endeavor to keep you informed of the progress made in our endeavors to recycle.




