A discussion of the problem with Field Scabious noxious weed is on going and the eradication will continue

in 2018 as outlined by the weed inspector, Barry Swanson.

Tara reported that the Cemetery data entry with the new record keeping software is progressing well and will be real asset when finished. Thank you to Marilyn Sorsdahl for her help with this.

Caretaker Darrin Evans attended the meeting and said everything was in order at the Cemetery. He submitted his resignation and introduced Jocelyn Siebert (Evans), who has worked with him since spring and is willing to take over the job. She was accepted by the Board and will start immediately with plans to tidy brush and branches to be destroyed with a controlled burn.

Funding for the Birch Hills Memorial Cemetery comes from Individual and Family Memorials, The Combined Appeal, Bequeaths and sale of plots. 
