

## Sack the Quarterback Fundraising Committee

Over the years, many groups from our community have committed their time and energy to raise funds for various projects to benefit our children, our families, our school and our Town. Sometimes it has been difficult to come up with unique ideas to our area to raise funds - and often there are several groups running fundraisers at the same time.

Three local groups will be working together to raise funds for each of their worthwhile community projects. "CHASE THE ACE" Progressive Jackpot is becoming a popular and entertaining vehicle in which to raise funds for community needs. The BH Volunteer Fire Department, TLC Daycare and RYSC Youth Skatepark have taken this idea and given it a slight twist......

SACK THE QUARTERBACK with the first draw Wednesday, Sept. 28.

The BH Volunteer Fire Department consists of over 20 members. They recently raised funds to replace their Command Unit and have now set a fundraising goal of \$12,000 to purchase new "Jaws of Life" which will enable them to safely and quickly extract victims trapped in newer vehicles.

TLC Daycare has 45 children from 6 months to 12 years in their care. They are fundraising to meet a \$15,000 goal to replace the aging and unsafe playground that was disposed of earlier this year to make way for a new, safe playground structure which meets current industry codes.

The park at top of Wilson Street, was built with RYSC Youth Group (BH Community Church) partnering with youth and parents in the community to provide a Skatepark, Basketball Court and Community Garden. In an effort to complete the Park, they have been working toward \$20,000 to complete the landscaping, an RC Dirt track and a Camp Gazebo to facilitate Park users and future community fundraisers and events.

HOW IT WORKS: Initially, SACK THE QUARTERBACK tickets will be sold several weeks in advance of the first draw to familiarize the community with the fundraiser. First draw will be held Wednesday, Sept. 28 and the winner will receive 20% of the ticket sales and a chance to draw the Quarterback card from a deck of Roughrider playing cards.... Winner must be there to draw the card or appoint someone to draw in their place. If the "Quarterback" card is drawn they will also receive the Progressive Prize starting at \$500. The Progressive Prize will continue to grow by 30% of weekly sales until won. After the initial draw, tickets will be sold every Wednesday from 5:30 - 7:30 pm ---tickets will be valid for date of purchase only. The draw for the weekly prize will be made at 7:45 pm with the winner drawing for the Progressive Prize immediately after. We are excited to work together on this fundraiser idea that has been so successful in many communities! We look forward to and appreciate your support!
