It has been brought to my attention that there is concern with drivers speeding on Wilson Street (known as the highway)



Marilyn Sorsdahl has done extensive research and compiled a book recording all the cemeteries in the R M of Birch Hills as well as Cemeteries outside this area. The book was recently updated and is available for viewing at the Museum, open Wednesday 2 to 4 pm

- * Flushing of the sewer lines on Bellamy and McCallum were approved.
- * Winter hours for EPS Management Bylaw Services were set and the August 2013 Monthly report was read




Awana Club started again on Tuesday nights at 6:45. It is for any kids ages 5-12 or K-grade 6. It is a ton of fun and the kids can earn


