TOWN OF BIRCH HILLS MUNICIPAL ELECTION 2012

Vote on October 24, 2012

Your vote in a municipal election will impact the quality of life in your community. Municipal councils make decisions about things that are crucial elements of daily life.

Your vote will impact the current and future sustainability of your community. Your vote is your opportunity to send a message on how you want your community governed. The more votes cast, the more powerful the message. Every vote counts. Your vote is your voice. Don't let others speak for you.

Who can vote?

To vote in a Saskatchewan urban municipal (town) election, you must

be a Canadian citizen on the day of the election, and

be age 18 years or older, and

have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six months, and

on the day of the election, in the case of a municipality other than a Resort Village, you must be a resident of the municipality for at least three months, or

the owner of assessable land situated in the municipality for at least three months

What to Look for in a Candidate - A Voter's Guide

As a voter, you may or may not know which candidate(s) to vote for. Depending on the issues facing your municipality, you may want to attend the meet the candidates evening (candidates' forum) to see where candidates stand on a particular issue.

Municipal Affairs has also prepared a Candidates Scorecard to assist voters when evaluating candidates on some general areas of interest.

You can view this at http://www.municipal.gov.sk.ca/Elections/Voters/Scorecard or stop by the town office for a copy. **Voter Identification**

As of March 2012 new requirements for voter identification for municipal elections are in effect similar to those in place for federal and provincial elections.

The purpose of the voter ID requirements is to maintain the integrity of local election processes. Your name and address must appear in some form on your voter identification documents. Bringing proper identification will ensure your voice is heard and will help your local election run as smoothly as possible.

Photo identification is your best option but there are other alternatives available to you.
