

FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN



Birch Hills United Church Women invite all those interested to a Fellowship of the Least Coin service of worship at 3 p.m. on Friday, November 6 in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Birch Hills.

The Fellowship of the Least Coin movement began in 1956 when the wounds of World War II were still sore and the victims of the nuclear bomb attack on Hiroshima and Nagasaki were not able to forgive the allies.

To seek reconciliation with the people of these war-torn countries, an international team, sponsored by the Presbyterian church women in the USA were instrumental in setting up the movement. When offering a prayer for peace, justice and reconciliation, each woman was asked to place a coin of the least currency of her country in a special money box. The least coin is significant because women in any economic context can give equally. This was how the movement for peace came to be called "Fellowship of the Least Coin".

The International Committee for the FLC meets annually to make grants for the coming year for projects that benefit women and children throughout the world. These grants are listed in the World Day of Prayer booklets.

The Birch Hills United Church women along with other local church women's groups support this ecumenical movement. Last year \$177.57 was forwarded to the Women's Inter-church Council of Canada.

MULTIUSE BUILDING ANNOUNCEMENT

Town Council and the Multiuse Building Committee are very excited to announce the development of this project. Early in 2014, the idea to create a multiuse building was discussed by members of council. Our Senior residents were using an aging building that was quickly requiring repairs that would be costly. As part of this conversation, and what Council may be able to assist with, the proposal of the Multiuse project was formed.

The old Co-op grocery store quickly became a building of interest as it had the required space, parking, and location. Members of Council met with Duane Lowe, and our building inspector, to determine the effectiveness, building requirements, and a general discussion on what we were trying to achieve. Duane Lowe graciously donated his time to create a floor plan that would get us pointed in the right direction, in terms of the planning process, and to most effectively use the space with which we had to work.

After months of planning and discussion, a decision was made by Mayor and Council, to submit an offer on the building, and move forward with project. The offer was made to Pasada Group which was accepted. Pasada Group also made a donation to the project, that will be detailed, along with other very important donations, in a future edition of the Heartbeat.

Throughout the planning process, and determining our needs, we also looked at Library Space and its usage. The Library will also be relocated to the Multiuse Building, allowing for increased area, and a possibility of additional features or uses of the Library. It was additionally determined that we would create a space for the Birch Hills Lions Club. This gives them a meeting room and areas for storage and counter space.

The interior of the building will be completely rebuilt with electrical, heating and plumbing, new walls and flooring. The exterior of the building will also be updated and modernized.

This project will greatly assist its user groups, and will boost interest in the business area of our town. We are very proud to make this announcement, and look forward to the positive effects it will have on our town. We will continue to update residents on a regular basis. In the near future we will announce a couple of very key donations to the project, outline timelines, aspects of fundraising, and also what we can do as a community to see this project through to completion.

GOLF COURSE NEWS

The Golf Board Members want to thank you for your patronage over the 2015 season. We had a good season and as far as we are concerned..... WE HAVE THE BEST GOLF COURSE AROUND!! Our sincere thank you to Ed Fusick, Carl Hanson and the other staff that worked diligently on the course itself. We were so pleased to welcome a number of students to employment with the golf course this year. Mr. Fusick - we cannot say enough about you. Mr. Fusick single-handedly saved the course approximately \$20,000 by refusing to give up on deteriorating equipment. We also had some creative ideas from our clubhouse managers making homemade boxed suppers for some harvesting farmers to a 'mystery' lunch to thank our annual membership holders, board members and employees as well as their immediate families. The volunteers, donations of equipment and labour and the fundraising efforts - never receive as much thanks and praise as they deserve!

We want to advise you of 2 programs we put into place (these have previously been done, but we have now formalized the polices that will be used).

Early payment of annual membership fees

To allow for the early purchase of an annual membership at *current rates to avoid a possible increase* in the new season, those who elect to purchase their memberships for the new season will have until January 15, 2016 to do this. If the rates increase in 2016, the purchaser will not have to pay the increase. The payment must be made IN FULL by January 15, 2016.

Installment payments of annual memberships

To allow for the gradual purchase of the annual membership through installment payments, those who elect to do this will be able to make up to 5 payments, via cash, money order or cheque (receipts will be given). You may start as soon as you wish but the final payment **must be made** no later than May 1st, 2016 and must include any new season increase. There will be an administration fee for any refunds.

DID YOU KNOW that our 2015 (single) adult membership of 525.00 is equal to about 28 - 9 hole rounds? This is truly bang for your buck! Especially if you pay this under our installment program. Those of you who previously purchased 2 or 3 - 10 packs in a season......THE ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP is a much better value ESPECIALLY with the option of the installment payments! The annual membership is UNLIMITED golf!

Stay tuned for information on our "Loyalty Program" and our "Pre-Paid Card Program" that will be replacing our 10-packs.
