WHO'S WHO IN BIRCH HILLS?

Congratulations to Harvey Gjesdal who recently received the Diamond Jubilee Medal. The medal recognizes exceptional Canadians for their contributions to their fellow citizens, communities and provinces and to our Country.

Harvey Gjesdal was born in the Lake Park District in 1922 and in 1950, he married Jennie Goplen. Together they raised 3 children. They are also blessed with 3 grandchildren.

Harvey has been farming well over 70 years. As well as farming, Harvey was also a Pedigreed Seed Grower for 47 years. Over the years, Harvey has also been on many community and political committees. He also wrote a column in the Grainews for 23 years.

In 1967, Harvey and Jennie's farm was recognized with the Master Farm Family Award for Northern Saskatchewan. In 1986, Harvey was inducted into the Canadian Agricultural Hall of Fame and later inducted into the Saskatchewan Hall of Fame. In 1992, Harvey was made a member of the Order of Canada. This was in recognition of his contributions to agriculture. He invented the Rotary Snow Blower and the Gjesdal 5 in 1 seed cleaner.

On behalf of the Skating Rink Board, the Town of Birch Hills, the Recreation Board, the community of Birch Hills, Skating Rink users and myself, I would like to sincerely thank everyone that offered their time, services and supplies to help with all the rink upgrades this past month. As many of you know the skating arena was in major need of some TLC and cosmetic upgrades.

The Minor Sports board has generously donated \$10,000 to fund some of these upgrades and we are awaiting response on a grant application through the government with the Western Economic Diversification funding program that would assist with other repairs to the ice surface area and the building.

In August each of the main user groups, Minor Hockey, the Skating Club, the Blackhawks Senior Team, Goosers Rec and Hawkeye Rec Teams were responsible for recruiting and completing their 'projects' ie: painting, plumbing upgrades, renovating the men's bathroom, upgrading the kitchen and cleaning floor mats. Also, there was a long list of smaller projects made up that several individuals offered to volunteer to help clean or repair.

As mentioned in previous write ups, the Skating rink is an essential asset to our community and, it takes a community to run it. Each of these upgrades up for hire would not be feasible for our rink at this present time. There are still a few renovations in the works but soon they will be done and because of those who volunteered their time and energy we have a renewed, safer and cleaner place for many to enjoy.

The Goosers were in charge of installing new toilets, sinks, and taps in all the bathrooms. (no more pink sink for our Senior Hockey team!) Thanks to Mark Rolfes for heading this project and to his helpers Jordan Carrier, Mitch Soyland, Aaron Swaby, Bruce Tilford, Shannon Vey, and Bill Yeaman. Thank you to Rick Szypula with RamWest Mechanical for saving us costs on the plumbing supplies.

Thank you to Kyle Nelson for braving the heights to seal the leak from the old chimney on the rink roof. To Tyler Cochrane, Brock Tilford, and other Hawkeye Players who have spent hours on repairing walls and replacing toilets and the sink in the men's bathroom. Thank you to Econo Lumber for donating supplies to fix the bathroom.

Thank you to Vince Harper for completely renovating the Ref Room. To Rick Bompais for heading up the ice making process with the help of Chevy, Stewart and Brent Adams, Kevin Lacombe, Moritz Philipp and Chris Tanner. To Rick Bompais and Bruce Tilford for temporarily fixing the heaved ice board in the south end so we have safe ice to skate on, free of surfacing gravel. Please note, that in the spring we will be asking for help to attempt to permanently fix the south end of the rink surface.

Thank you to the Blackhawks for the heavy lifting of moving mats to sweep and mop in all the dressing rooms and hallway and for re-painting their dressing room. To Elston Macfie for cleaning and re-painting the Hawkeye dressing room. To Doug Rutherford for installing the canteen window display and locating us new chairs for the lobby. To Brad Halayka for electrical upgrades. To Bryan Waite for painting the lobby, stairways, three downstairs dressing rooms and hallway... What a difference a coat of paint makes!
