#### **Anonymous Donation to Birch Hills School** November 29, 2017

The principal of Birch Hills Public School received an amazing phone call a few weeks ago. Can you imagine a phone call out of the blue from someone who is interested in supporting children and youth with a significant donation? Birch Hills Public School, and the entire Saskatchewan Rivers School Division, are amazed and grateful at the generosity of a Birch Hills School alumni who recently made such a phone call. Jeff Court, the Principal of Birch Hills Public School, recently received this call and days later, a visitor stopped by the school with a check for \$100,000.

This is a private donation from a former student of the school. It is not a corporate gift. The donor, who prefers to remain anonymous, made it clear that the donation is unconditional and nothing is expected in return. His wishes are that the donation will encourage all alumni to come forward and remember the contribution they received from their public school experience. Alumni frequently donate to post-secondary institutions but rarely give financial support to their public school Pre-K to 12 education which has been equally influential in molding their future.

"We are honored and humbled by this generous donation to the Birch Hills Public School community," said Mr. Court. "We graciously accept the challenge to manage this gift wisely as we positively impact the current and future students of Birch Hills." It is an exciting opportunity to be privileged by this amazing gift.

Mr. Court, along with the students, staff and the parents are in progress with plans for how to best use this donation. There are a number of possible ideas, but as Mr. Court indicated, they will take the time to plan for the best possible current and long range benefits to students. The students and families will certainly express gratitude in a number of ways, but perhaps the best way to say thanks is to ensure that his gift is well-used to support students. The Birch Hills school community will certainly make sure that happens.




