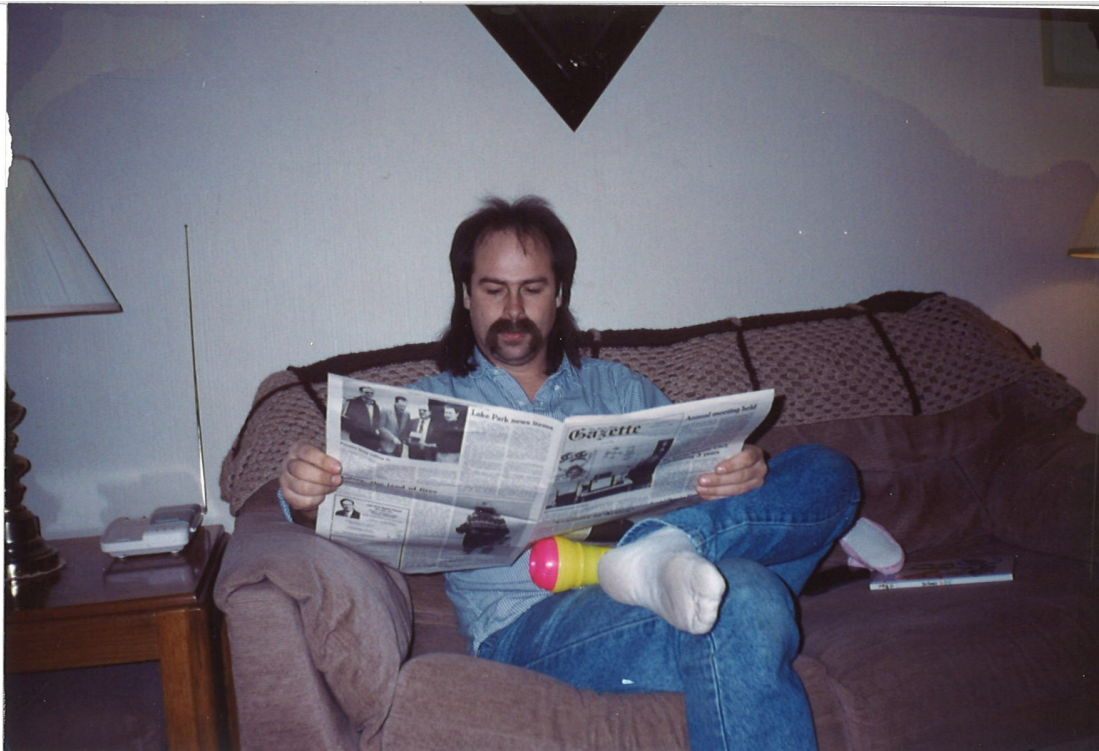

Royal Canadian Legion Birch Hills Branch 122

Who are we and what do we do

The Royal Canadian Legion cares for all those who have served our nation. As members, we show our thanks by supporting and advocating for members and their families and continuing the tradition of service in helping our communities.

An appeal for unity within the numerous Veterans groups and regimental associations created after the end of the First World War led to the formation of the Dominion Veterans Alliance. In 1925 "The Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League" was founded. In July of 1926 it was incorporated by a special Act of Parliament. In 1960, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II gave her consent to use the prefix 'Royal', and the organization became known as 'The Royal Canadian Legion.'

Our Birch Hills charter is dated Feb 21 1929. Annual membership dues are \$50.00, of which about one third is retained by the local branch while the remainder forwarded to Dominion and Provincial Command. There are currently 37 paid Birch Hills members, down from over 50 in 2020. We hold regular monthly meetings from September to June, part of the 250,000 strong Legion members in Canada, the largest veterans support and advocacy group in Canada, For many years now membership has been open to all Canadians. Our primary objectives are remembrance and advocacy for veterans support as well as community and youth support and service.

How do we do this within our community? We hold the annual Remembrance Day Service at the Civic Center followed by a luncheon, and evening meal at the Legion Hall. We offer honor guard attendance at end of life services of members. We manage the local Poppy Campaign. We support education through annual bursaries that are locally funded with some of our poppy funds. Provincial scholarship applications are also available through our branch. We encourage education and remembrance with the annual school Remembrance Day art and literary contest. We own and manage our Legion Hall for the use of our members as well as limited use by others within the community. Our club generally participates in Legion curling, including hosting the provincial playoffs in 2011 and Dominion Legion Curling championship in 2015. We have held many golf tournaments. In 2019 we started a winter drop in dart night. Not least, we contribute to larger and wider efforts through our support of our Provincial and National Commands. For example, the Legion is recognized for having an excellent national track and field competition for youths aged 12-17.

The last few years we have continued to upgrade and maintain our hall at 114 Bellamy St. that was built in 1961. We purchased dart boards and related equipment and are in the process of having our billiards table refurbished. Very recently we installed new energy efficient windows in the basement and front of the building.

Our membership is shrinking and it is challenging for many of our members to participate in special events or fundraising. Some of our executive need a break. Nevertheless the Birch Hills Legion Branch 122 remains a meaningful organization and is worth keeping. More participation would ensure our survival and could allow us to do much more.

Are you a current member but not really active? Have you been a member but are not currently paid up or have you been a member of the Legion Auxiliary because at the time you were unable to hold a Legion membership. Have you never been a member? Does holding a membership interest you?

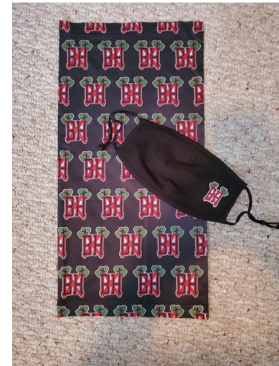

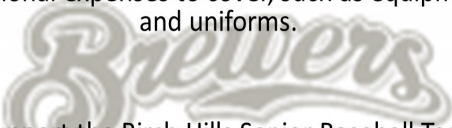
