R.M. of Birch Hills #460, and

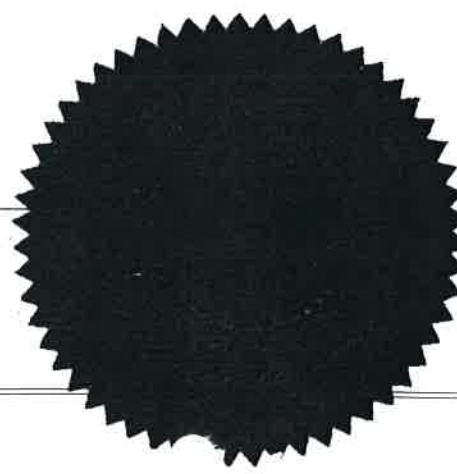
R.M. of Invergordon #430, and



RE: The formation of a Mutual Aid Emergency Measures Organization in the Birch Hills and District Area.

As Emergency Measures Co-ordinator for Birch Hills, I have been approached by the Provincial Emergency Measures Organization to initiate organization of a Mutual Aid Area in our District. The area under consideration is outlined on the Attached map and list of possible participants.

The objectives of forming such a Mutual Aid Area and Committee would be:

- a) To provide a unified, effective organization involving neighbouring communities to lend reciprocal assistance, expertise, and equipment in a declared disaster or needed situation.
- b) To provide an effective program of communications involving modern equipment and training in the event of a disaster.
- c) To meet and prepare an up-to-date list of available resources in each community inclusive of equipment and manpower services. Each municipality will list it's own resources and manpower and furnish the Mutual Aid Area Co-ordinator with such a list including telephone numbers of municipal officials, key personnel, etc.
- d) To prepare the necessary documentation to be submitted to the responsible bodies in the attainment of material, funding, or consultative services for the betterment of the program.

That, without limiting the general objectives of the Mutual Aid Area, the following projects receive priority:

- a) To implement a more effective and current area communications system.
- b) To secure modern Emergency Response Equipment.
- c) To prepare and update various resource manuals.
- d) To develop and utilize Emergency Response Training Centers.
