Our offerings change often, so drop in to see what we have been cooking, smoking and baking.



Graduation 2021 Celebration

The 2021 Graduating class along with the parents and school truly believe it takes a village to raise a child. Although we are all faced with substantial restrictions due to the current pandemic we looked for ways that community members would be able to join us in recognizing the achievement of our graduating class. This year's planned activities include a Cap and Gown ceremony, Golf cart parade in the community and a Graduation ceremony.

The 2021 Graduation activities are planned to be held outdoors (weather dependent) at the football field in behind the school, with all required COVID protocols in place. For community members wishing to attend this will be a drive in graduation only with everyone in attendance required to follow restrictions in place on the date of the event (June 25th). These include:

- All **registered** community members must attend in a vehicle and park in a designated parking spot (white painted parking stalls on grass). Community members cannot attend without a vehicle and access the school property.
- Vehicles will be prohibited from driving on the playing surface of the football field (area will be roped off).

Vehicle occupants must be from the same household.

- Vehicle occupants must either remain in the vehicle or stay within arm's reach of it at all times.
- Vehicle occupants cannot pass items or otherwise interact with neighboring vehicles (2 m separation)
- We would ask that vehicles position themselves in a fashion that does not detract from others view. Ie large vehicles on sides or back rows on designated spots.

Washroom access will not be available.

Vehicle occupants can tune their FM radio to 103.9 FM to better hear the presentations in addition to the sound system that will be in use.

The Cap and Gown ceremony is planned for 11 am, the golf cart parade in the community will commence at 6:30 pm (map available on BH Public School Facebook page) with the graduation Grand March ceremony at 7:30 pm back at the football field.

In order for Community members to get access to one of the limited number of registered parking stalls a request must be emailed to Shae Adams at <u>shaebog-er@hotmail.com</u>

Available designated parking stalls will be allotted on a first come basis up to the max. number that will fit within the overall area following provincial restrictions. The total number will be determined as parking stalls are marked and designated on the school property within view of the graduating class.

Should our Sask weather not cooperate and require this event to move indoors, it will be moved to the Baptist Church. Unfortunately in that scenario community members will not be able to attend unless specifically invited by one of the graduating class members up to the max allotment of 150 people.

Any questions feel free to reach out to any of the families of the 2021 graduating class.

The re-opening of Birch Hills Historical Society's Museum and Thrift Store is still uncertain, though the society is hoping to be back into operation by September.

The latest complication is a roof leak which needs attention. The heavy rains of the week of June 7th created some damage, requiring insurance adjustment and repair.

We are happy that there was no significant damage to the artefacts in the museum, but there are floor and ceiling issues to be addressed.
