



Did you know that 2021 is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of when the poppy was first officially used in Canada as a symbol of Remembrance? The following is taken from an editorial in the Legion Magazine Nov/Dec 2021 issue.

"The bleak, muddy terrain of Western Europe during the First World War was trenched, scarred, bombed and cratered into oblivion. The ground and greenery were scorched by shellfire and poisoned by gas. It seemed nothing could exist here. Only death. But amid the chaos and carnage, bright red poppies sprouted and blossomed in no man's land and among the graves of the fallen.

In 1918 Moina Michael and Anna Guerin promoted wearing artificial poppies to commemorate the Armistice. In 1921 the Great War Vererans Asso of Canada, predecessor to The Royal Canadian Legion, decided the poppy should be worn in Canada every Nov 11 on Armistice Day" (Remembrance Day).

This year, Duane Mohn, our Birch Hills Legion chaplain, conducted a remembrance day service at the Legion hall followed by a noon luncheon with 15 members attending. We appreciate all those who placed donations in our poppy trays and those businesses who provided that service. Unfortunately, we did not have a public service because of Covid protocols in place at the time.

Additionally we would like to thanks Individual and groups who would typically place wreaths and contribute in Remembrance at a public service as well as all the school children who participated in the annual Remembrance Day poster and literary competition.

We will publicize major donors and School competition winners once we gather all the information.






Thanks to Ron for grooming the cross-country and snowshoe trails.


