#### Birch Hills Blackhawks - 2021-2022 Twin Rivers Hockey League Champions

After a heartbreaking end to their 2019-2020 championship and provincial run and an early end to the 2020-2021 hockey season, the Birch Hills Blackhawks are the **2021-2022 Twin Rivers Hockey League Champions**.

Birch Hills faced the Clavet Cougars in the first round of playoffs. In game 1, the Cougars scored 5 unanswered goals to skate away with a 5 to 2 victory on Birch Hills' home ice. Game 2 was a nail-biter; the Blackhawks were up 3 to 1 with just over 1 minute left in the 3<sup>rd</sup> period, when Clavet scored to close the gap to 1 goal. They scored again with 16 seconds remaining in regulation time to tie the game. Birch Hills scored the sudden victory goal 1 minute and 16 seconds into the overtime period to win game 2 in Clavet. The Blackhawks were victorious in Game 3 with an 8 to 2 win on home ice.

The Blackhawks were victorious in their semi-final series against the Warman Wildcats, winning the best of 5 series 3 games to 1. Game 1 was a 5-0 shutout win for the Blackhawks. Warman tied up the series with a 6-4 win over Birch Hills in game 2. The Blackhawks won 4-3 in overtime in game 3 and in game 4, they won 5-2 to advance to the final series.

The Shellbrook Silvertips defeated the Rosthern Wheatkings 3 games to 1 to advance to the final series vs. Birch Hills. This was a rematch of the TRHL final series from 2 years ago when hockey was shut down across Canada due to Covid-19. The Blackhawks were leading the series 1-0 when this occurred.

Game 1 was a back-and-forth game, with Birch Hills coming out of the game with a 6-4 win. Game 2 in Shellbrook was another exciting game, with the Silvertips tying the game with less than 2 minutes left to send the game into overtime. The Blackhawks scored less than 1 minute into the 10-minute sudden victory overtime period to win 4-3. Game 3 was back in front of the home crowd. Birch Hills led 2-1 after the first period. After 40 minutes of play, the score was tied 3-3. The Blackhawks came out strong in the 3rd period and scored 3 goals to win the game by a score of 6-3 over the Silvertips.

The team would like to thank their board, coaches (Todd Becker, Bruce Tilford & Zach Becker), volunteers, sponsors and especially the fans for their support during the season. The team could not operate without the contributions and support of everyone involved.

#### Town and RM Battle Field Scabious

For a number of years the Town and RM of Birch Hills have been waging war on the weed Field Scabious.

The weed has been found growing in and around the cemetery. Infestations have also been found west of the cemetery and in the ditches adjacent to highways 3 & 25.

Field Scabious is a very invasive weed and has earned a spot on the 'prohibited' weed list under the provincial Weed Control Act. A single plant can produce 1,000's of seeds over one summer. The seeds drop to the ground and are spread by wind, water and birds. The intention of the control project is to eliminate the weed using a combination of timely mowing and/or chemical application.

Local residents may have noticed the cemetery looking a bit ragged in the spring as mowing is delayed.

Delayed mowing allows time for the Field Scabious to grow and stick its head up above the grass.

Once the weed can be easily seen, control measures can take place. Unfortunately, this may take until the end of June. The weed

can grow to a height of 1 m with many stems and flower heads. It is thought that someone may have unknowingly planted an imported wild flower mix, containing Field Scabious seed, around a grave site.

Field Scabious is actually a common yard flower in many parts of Europe. It is known for its colorful violet/blue flower, similar to a Bachelor Button, and is very attractive to bees.

The area in and around the cemetery is monitored over the summer by Weed Inspector Barry Swanson.

Local residents will note a multitude of colored flags in the area over the summer – each marking a Field Scabious plant. Infestations, both old and new, are flagged and control measures taken. The location of the weed varies from year to year as both new and old seed can germinate. The long term goal goal is to keep the plants from setting seed and spreading to adjacent farm land.

Cooperators on this ongoing project are the Town of Birch Hills, RM of Birch Hills, Lake Country Co-op and the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure.
