

### **Tommy Douglas**

The depression and drought of the 1930s, followed by the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War, created hardship for the people of Saskatchewan. When the CCF (NDP) was elected in 1944 (with 47/52 seats), Premier Tommy Douglas lifted that burden in many ways – electricity to 60,000 farms, support for co-ops and credit unions, and public utilities like SaskPower, SaskTel and STC.

# In 1962, Tommy & his successor, Woodrow Lloyd, introduced the first publicly-funded health care in North America. MEDICARE!

Because of its success, Medicare was finally introduced for <u>ALL</u> of Canada in 1966 – by the Pearson government - <u>with support from the NDP.</u>

We still have it today! No bills when we see a doctor or stay in a hospital. This is why Tommy Douglas has been voted "the Greatest Canadian".
