We have unfortunately seen other clubs in the rural areas close their doors due to low membership and that is not the case for our rink. We are thriving and our board is proud to say that our membership continues to exceed our expectations and our bonspiels are events that our curlers and community members look forward to every year. For this reason, we did not hesitate to move forward and upgrade the ice plant even though the financial obligation is of considerable size.

Our club is looking for financial support from the community to assist with the \$86,000 owing for the curling club's share of the upgrade. (ice plant is shared with the skating rink) This support can take place through attending fundraisers this season, and we look forward to bringing activities to the community that will be fun and profitable for our club. This support can also be received by donation. If anyone in the community and surrounding area would like to contribute with a donation, we would greatly appreciate your support. You can send your donation to The Town of Birch Hills and in return receive a taxable receipt for your generosity. A minimum of \$25 to receive a receipt, make cheques payable to Town of Birch Hills with a note that the money is to go towards the curling rink.

Foodgrains Final Report

The Birch Hills and Community Foodgrains Grow Project has wrapped up for it's final year. We forwarded a cheque for \$ 72,029.00 to the head office as our final contribution.

The project stated in 2005 and has been active for the past 18 years. In this time span we have contributed a total of \$ 548,487.00. This money goes to help feed many people in third world countries. The Canadian Government matches our contribution 4 to 1 so the total is actually \$ 2,742,435.00

In third world countries cost of food is about \$2.00 per day. So we have impacted the lives of thousands of people and saved many lives.

The committee would like to thank all the people and business that have contributed to the project over the past eighteen years.

These include local farmers who have donated their time and equipment to farm the land, machine dealerships who have donated equipment for seeding and harvest, chemical companies that had donated chemicals and seed, elevator companies that have donated fertilizer and chemical and individuals that donated cash to meet some of our input costs.

This has been a well supported endeavor and as a community we can be proud of our success.
