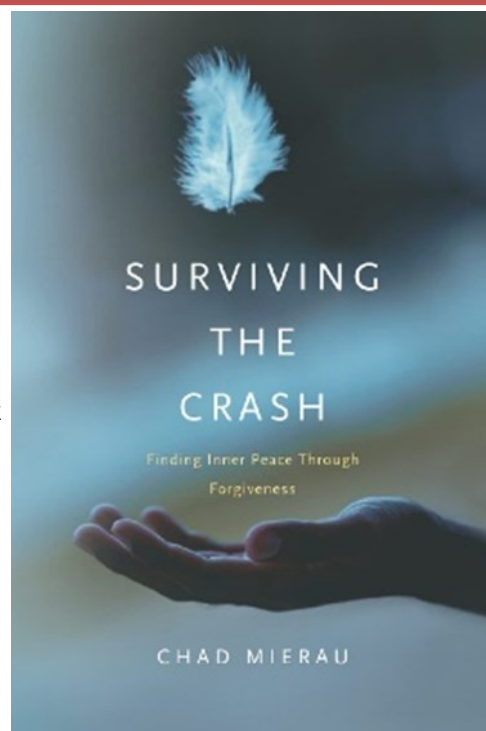

As he started to share his thoughts and feelings with others, changes started happening and he felt an overwhelming sense that people worldwide needed to hear his story and understand his journey.



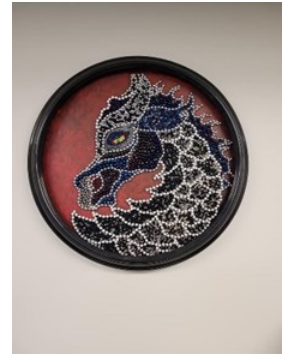

QUEENS JUBILEE PLATINUM MEDAL AWARDS

Thanks to Adam and Logan for grooming the cross-country ski trails. No snowshoe trails have been groomed so far this year.

If you don't know where the greens and tee boxes are, we ask that you please snowshoe beside the ski trails or on the existing trails. If you ski or snowshoe on the greens and tee boxes, the snow compacts and we could have winter kill, which may result in being unable to use the course in future winters.

If we notice a trail that needs a detour, we will post signs at the golf course. People have already been snowshoeing / tobogganing on the practice green, the nursery green, and holes 6 & 8 tee boxes. (We haven't checked all of them yet.)

Walkers (people & dogs) and snowshoers may use the snowshoe trails, but not the ski trails as it ruins the trails.

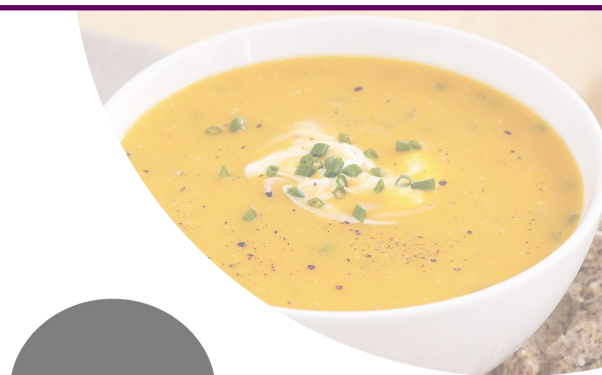
