The words of Tyness Meadows- Current Health Care Manager of Birchview Home

Forty years is a long time, did you know trivia is such an interesting way to look at what has changed and what was important to us way back when. It really isn't the trivia though that connects us to the interesting facts of the past, it is what we were doing and who or how we were doing it with others. In 1983 there were members of the community and surrounding area that were leaving their homes to make Birchview their home. There was also a generation of Health Care Workers that were moving into new roles at Birchview. I imagine that many of them really had no idea what they were getting themselves into and how it would impact their lives as they stood in a newly built Facility awaiting the first new residents to walk through the doors and make the Facility a Home.

When it comes to Long Term Care there has been a lot of evolution in what it is, who and how it supports and how we view it. The truth is these Homes were once very medical in their model and they run a tight ship. What seems to have really created evolution is families wanting Facilities to be homes in as many senses of the word possible. New philosophies like the Eden model have contributed to this change by challenging the notion of integrating large scale structure with small scale personal connection and attention.

I have often wondered how at Birchview, Eden took like weeds to a garden or deer to the farmer's fields. In my time with Birchview, I think I have experienced some of the contributing factors. There really is a deep connection between the staff and the residents and the community. In fact, many of the staff once retired have come back to serve the home in one way or another. Many of the families, have come back to the home long after their loved one's have passed to serve the new residents of the home and the team of staff through their volunteer engagement. Even a number of our staff teams come back to the home to volunteer their time to activities to serve the residents or just to spend time with them. It is not like they are not spending enough time here on paid time and more paid time and more that they often do not want – yet they keep coming to serve.

Folks that have had family here, have shared stories of how their family members had really felt cared for at Birchview. In some cases, folks would try one home then another and for them, Birchview was like momma bears bed and chair and porridge. It was just right. We all have unique and specific needs and wants and for many, they found it ant Birchview.

Birch Hills seems to have viewed Birchview, over the years, as a part of their family and fabric. The community seems to take pride in caring for Birchview. Perhaps it is a deep respect for those that come to make Birchivew their home, for their contributions to building our present through their past.

It is hard to say what things will look like in 40 years let alone 5 or 10 years. A supportive community, engaged families, dedicated staff teams and residents who claim their space here as Home will continue to shape Birchview's future with their stories, support and direction.

So Look for us, Celebrating Birchview 40<sup>th</sup>, at the Threshing Day parade on August 13<sup>th</sup>, We will be the ones wearing Yellow and Green!

#### This Tender Land By: William Kent Krueger




